At FundaMental Health, we believe that access to mental healthcare is a fundamental right and it is our mission to break down barriers and improve access.

Bridge to Care is committed to advancing health equity by connecting Medi-Cal recipients with complex needs to compassionate, coordinated care. Through trauma-informed practices and strong community partnerships, we help individuals experiencing homelessness, serious health conditions, or behavioral health challenges navigate services and build pathways to stability, wellness, and hope.

Bridge to Care proudly serves Medi-Cal recipients throughout San Diego County, with a focus on communities facing the greatest barriers to accessing coordinated care. Whether individuals reside in urban centers, transitional housing, or underserved neighborhoods, our team meets them where they are: virtually, in the community, or in partnership with local providers.

Client Populations of Focus

Bridge to Care serves individuals across the lifespan who face complex health and social challenges. This includes homeless families, unaccompanied children, and youth at risk for hospitalization or emergency care due to serious mental illness or substance use. We also support children and youth enrolled in California Children's Services (CCS) or involved in child welfare, up to age 26. For adults, our focus includes those experiencing homelessness with chronic health conditions, individuals with serious behavioral health needs, and those at risk for avoidable hospital or emergency department utilization.

Services & Capacity

FundaMental Health's Bridge to Care program offers trauma-informed Enhanced Care Management (ECM) services to adults and children with complex needs. Services include linkage to Community Supports, medical, behavioral health, housing, transportation, and social service needs. We currently serve Medi-Cal recipients with Blue Shield Promise Health Plan, Molina Healthcare, and Kaiser Permanente.

Client Populations of Focus

Comprehensive treatment centers (CTCs) provide medication-assisted treatment & counseling to adults age 18 & older who are struggling with opioid use disorder.

Medications such as methadone, Suboxone®, buprenorphine, vivitrol, & naltrexone can alleviate the distress of opioid withdrawal & allow patients to regain physical strength & mental clarity, while counseling helps make the lifestyle changes that will enable a pursuit of an opioid-free future.

Counseling sessions at CTCs are safe & supportive environments where learning about addiction & recovery, identifying & addressing challenges that may have contributed to opioid use, & learning how to avoid relapse are possible.

Individual sessions are one-on-one meetings where processing experiences & receiving focused feedback from a member of the treatment team happen.

Group counseling sessions at CTCs involve a small number of individuals who are also receiving care for opioid use disorder, along with one or more treatment professionals where experiences are shared through learning more about opioid addiction, treatment, & recovery; practicing healthy communication & self-advocacy skills; & sharing support with others who have experienced similar struggles.


