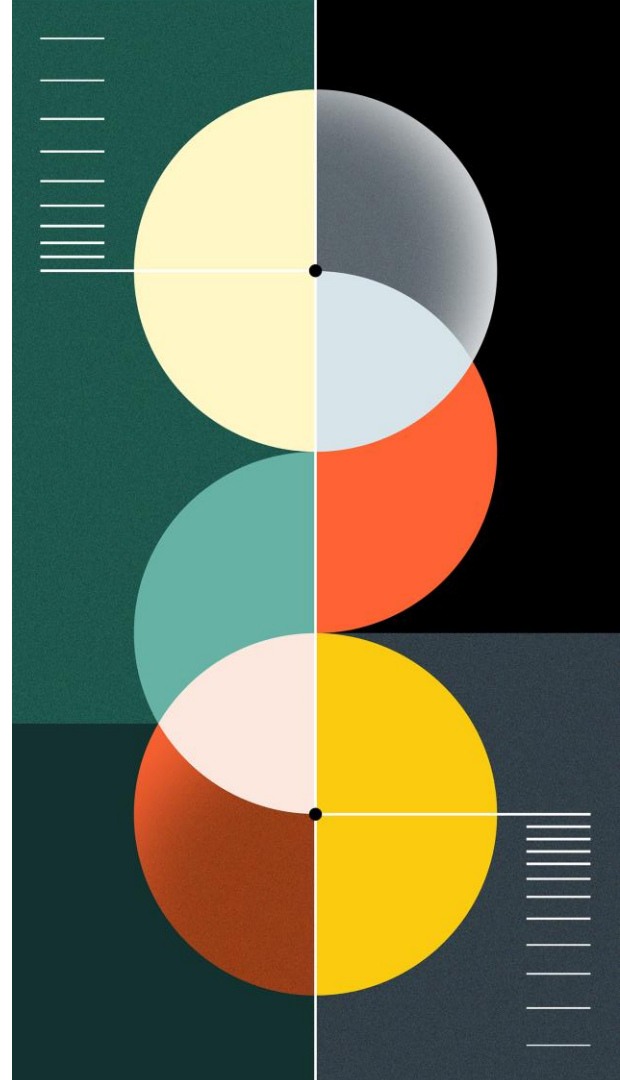

Submitting Referrals | ECM, CS, and CHW

Kaiser Permanente (KP) has a no-wrong-door approach to referrals.

- Referrals are accepted from any source (members, providers, family, community organizations, etc.)
- Referrals may be placed via email, via phone, or through KP Health Connect.
- Referrals are reviewed within 5 business days to determine if the Member is eligible.

Children & Youth Workflow

- Developed and implemented a locally-originated Children and Youth ECM referral workflow that was formally presented to a statewide audience by DHCS in October 2025, establishing Contra Costa as a leader in youth access to care.

Deep Dive Learning Symposiums

- Hosted two critical Deep Dive Symposiums focused on long-term sustainability:
 - Food as Medicine Symposium (February) to optimize CalAIM and food security efforts.
 - Perinatal Services Symposium (November) to secure the future of care for mothers and infants.

Provider Fair

- Successfully hosted a Collaborative Provider Fair in October 2025, which connected 80 local ECM and Community Support providers to enhance partnership and care coordination.

- Host symposiums and dedicated spaces for certain populations (i.e., perinatal symposium, FAM symposium)

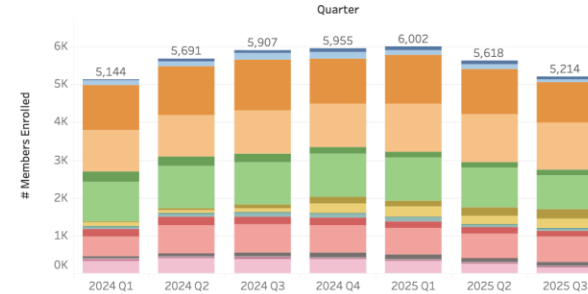

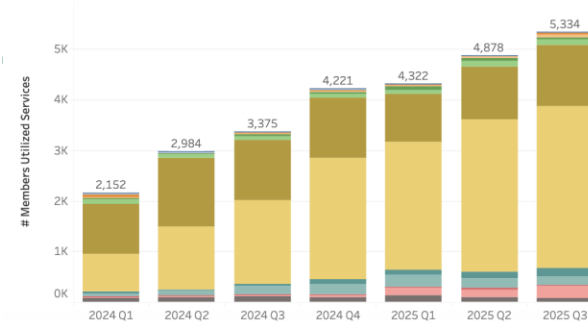
Number of Members Enrolled in Enhanced Care Management per Quarter

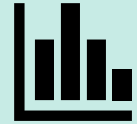

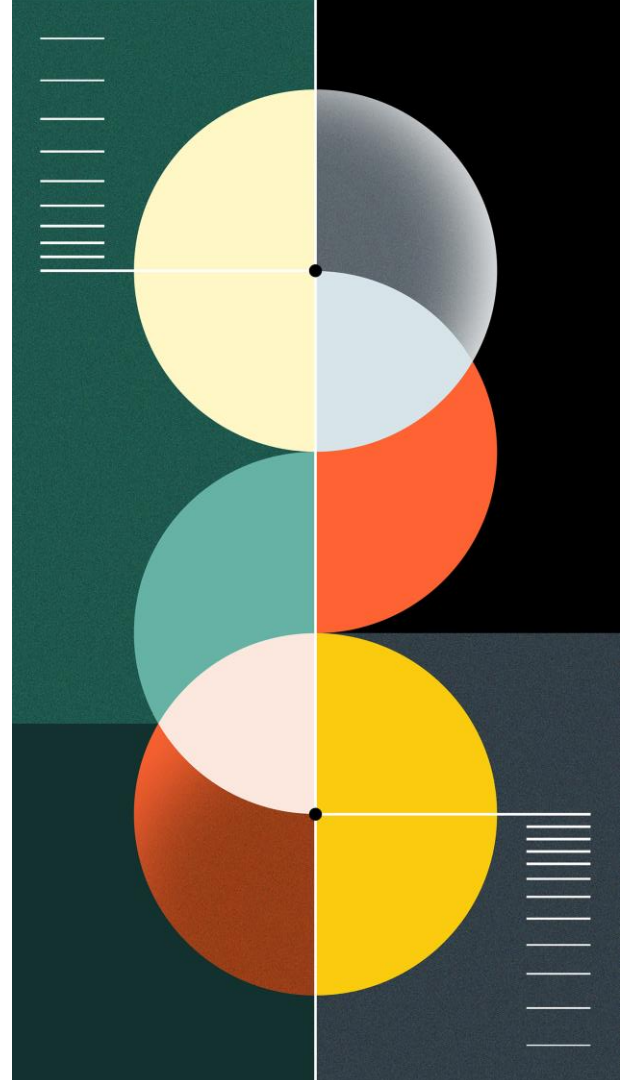

Pathways for Applying to the TAM

Organizations who ...



Option 1)

Have **CONTRACTED** with a Managed Care Partner (MCP) or other eligible entity to provide ECM/Community Support services



Option 2)

Are **PLANNING TO CONTRACT** with an MCP or other eligible entity to provide ECM/Community Support services or actively exploring that possibility with an MCP or other eligible entity



Option 3)

Who get separate **DHCS APPROVAL** which requires applicants to deliver the types of services that would enable them to eventually contract with an MCP or other eligible entity to provide ECM/Community Supports

Additional TA Marketplace Eligibility Criteria

- Projects will be approved only for new TA Recipients, unless the Recipient is applying for Transitional Rent.
 - If Recipient had a TA Marketplace project Scope of Work fully executed before June 24, 2025, then the Recipient is **eligible** for one additional 2026 TA project focused on Transitional Rent.
 - If Recipient has had a TAM project since June 24, 2025, they are **not eligible** for additional TA Marketplace support.

More about the FMCH Director Role at CC Health

The FMCH Programs is part of Contra Costa's Community Health Branch. These programs include eight programs that fall under the Maternal, Child and Adolescent Health (MCAH) funding stream from CDPH. The FMCH Director acts as the MCAH Director and is the liaison to the California Department of Public Health/Maternal, Child and Adolescent Health Division. The Director plans, organizes, directs, and monitors policies, programs, and other activities that integrate and enhance public health services for families, women, and children; supervises and directs the work of FMCH program managers; represents the Public Health Division in inter-divisional activities and performs related work as required. The FMCH Director participates as a member of the Public Health Division's senior management team.
